# 1. Introduction

Beijing GNOME User Group (BJGUG) team proposed to the GNOME.Asia Committee and the GNOME Foundation that the upcoming GNOME.Asia Summit 2014 to be hosted in Beijing.

Beijing is the capital of the People's Republic of China, has been the political and cultural center of China for centuries. The city is renowned for its opulent palaces, temples, and huge stone walls and gates, and its art treasures and universities have made it a center of culture and art in China. There are good airport connections, train/bus infrastructure and subway infrastructure.

In China there are a lot of GNOME hackers, especially in Beijing, which are from SUSE, Redhat, Canonical, Oracle, Intel, etc.

The tentative dates of the event will be around the GNOME 3.9/3.10 release and at the weekend.

It's easy to get VISA for foreign participants / speakers, some countries in Asia, such as Japan and Singapore have a 15days visa-free period for travel within Beijing.

Finally, we strongly believe Beijing is the best place to host this upcoming conference and hack-fest.

### 1) *About us*

Beijing GNOME User Group(BJGUG), is a not for profit open-source organization based in Beijing. After the GNOME.Asia 2008 in Beijing, BJGUG was established in 2008 and aimed to spread GNOME for users, developers and translators in Beijing and China.

In 2009 we designed our logo, looks like a butterfly, which is mean BJGUG and GNOME could break the cocoon into a butterfly, spreading and developing quickly in Beijing and China.

The second one, GNOME.Asia and openSUSE.Asia host parallelized, finally we got a concurrence with openSUSE.Asia, so we prepare to use the second option.

### **3. Objectives**

We have some small objectives in GNOME.Asia 2014.

1) Grow GNOME contributors, users and developers in China/Asia

2) Grow Women participation in GNOME

The Outreach Program for Women is very quickly grow up in Europe, so we hope more people from Asia could participate.

3) Communicate with more local Linux company

Now there are a lot of local Linux organization such as Deepin, Ubuntukylin, so hope we have a chance to know each other.

4) Promote GSoC in Asia, especially in students

In GSoC 2013 there are 31 GNOME projects accepted, so we hope more students in Asia could have chance to apply it.

As you know in GNOME.Asia 2008 in Beijing we selected this place. And we had cooperated with BeiHang University sever times recently, some small meeting room(~30 persons) is free to use, but for the bigger one, it will need pay, I got the price list from them, we'll talk it later.

Currently we still can't get the picture by ourselves, we could use classroom(~30p) as the hacking room, and the biggest hall looks like below, has 433 seats, which could be used as our proposed venue.

## b) University of Chinese Academy of Sciences

This is the another choice for the Venue.

We had an GNOME3.0 Launch Parth at in 2011, and there are a big classroom looks like above photo, it's about 200 seats, which is could be used as our proposed venue, there are also some smaller room(~30 seats) can be used for free.

### c) **TsingHua University**

TsingHua University is the No.1 in Beijing and China, it's very famous, in recent event we cooperate with TsingHua several times, we had hold some release party in their meeting room, we could get an discount for rent the meeting room, so I thought it should be an option for our venue.

The FIT in TsingHua is modern and new building, have a lot of classroom and meeting room, but unfortunately I still can't get the picture of it now.

## **6. Activities and schedule**

### **1) Hack-fest**

The hack-fest will be similar to a non-conference, a wiki page can be put up to allow participants to write down their proposed topics. The whole day event is free schedule.

Possible activities include localization, discussion and some cool topic to hacking GNOME.

### **2) Training**

Training session, one day before the summit, certification, training topics, refer to previous training topic.

Another option is to have an Install-fest to help students install the GNOME Desktop.

Before the beginning day, May 16 or May 23 (Friday)

### **3) Conference**

Conference just like previous GNOME.Asia, no very big difference.

It will include Keynotes, Talks, Lightning Talks. Please view the blow list for specific schedule.

We also prepare Booths for sponsor( exhibitions from 8:00 to 17:00).
